This user's guide describes the procedure for installing and performing the CV and xHCI test.

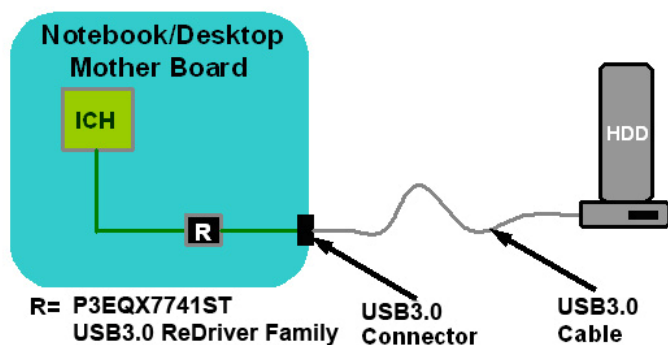


Figure 1 Typical Application in Notebook and Desktop

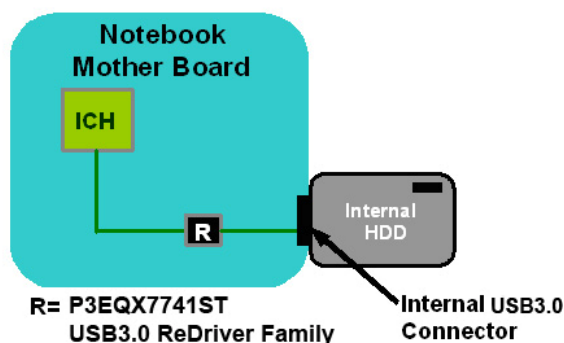


Figure 2. A Typical Application in Notebook

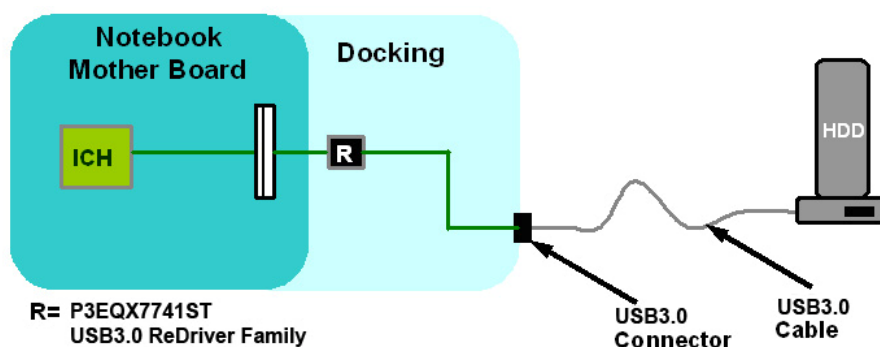


Figure 3. A Typical Application in Notebook with Docking

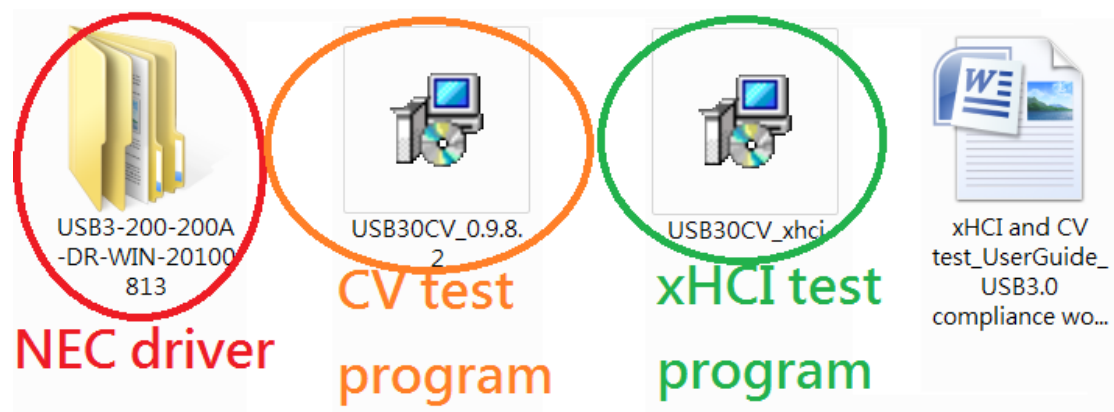
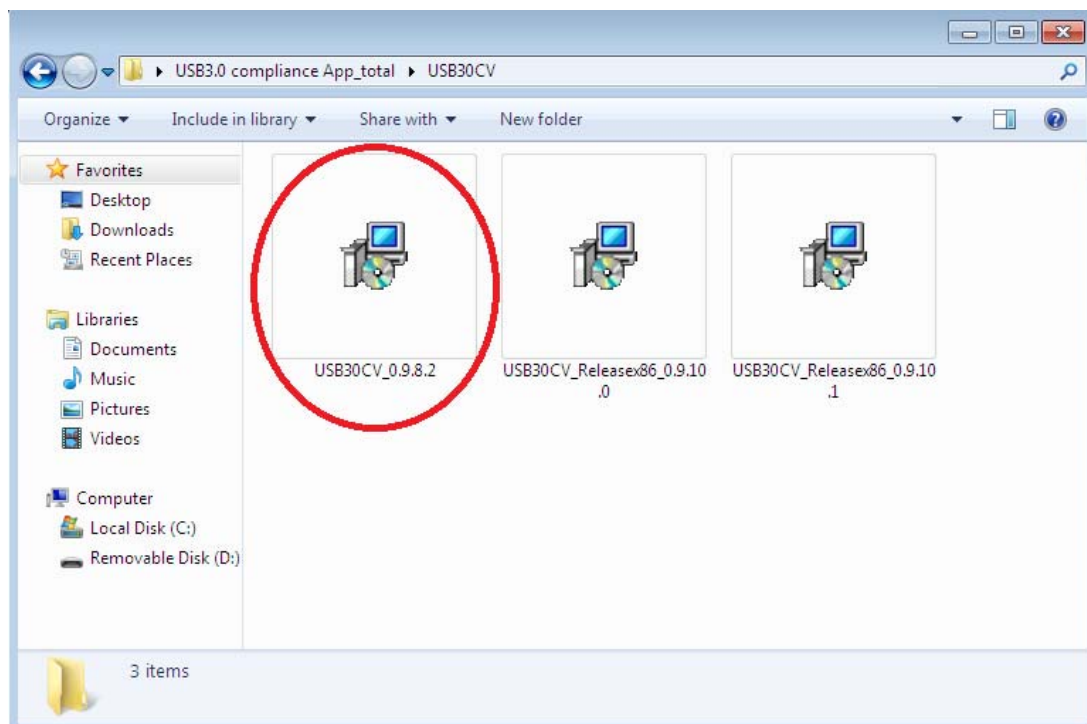


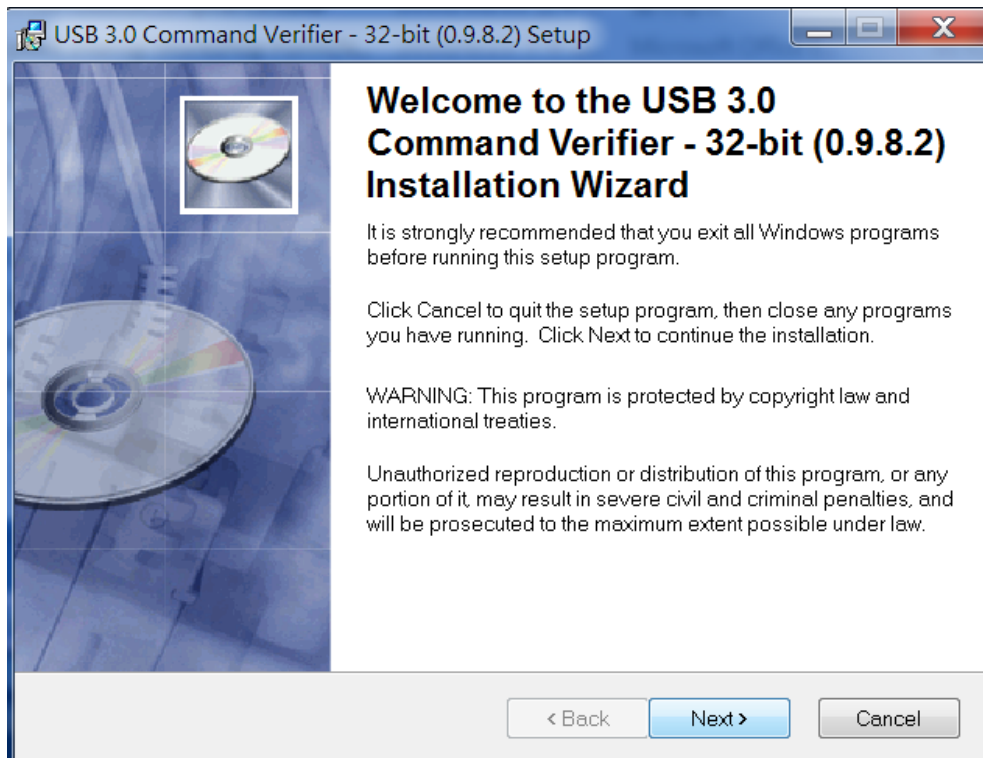
Figure 1 Installation files

1. CV test program from USB-IF web side: USB30CV\_0.9.8.2.msi
2. Driver for USB3.0 host controller driver (normal): NEC.host.driver.USB3-200-200A-DR-WIN-20100813
3. Download "usb.if" file from website ([http://www.usb.org/developers/tools/comp\\_dump](http://www.usb.org/developers/tools/comp_dump)) and put it into "USBCV/lib" folder
4. Please see the Readme file for driver location (this driver should be used for CV & xHCI test):
5. xHCI test program from USB-IF org Diane Rose: USBCV\_xHCI.msi

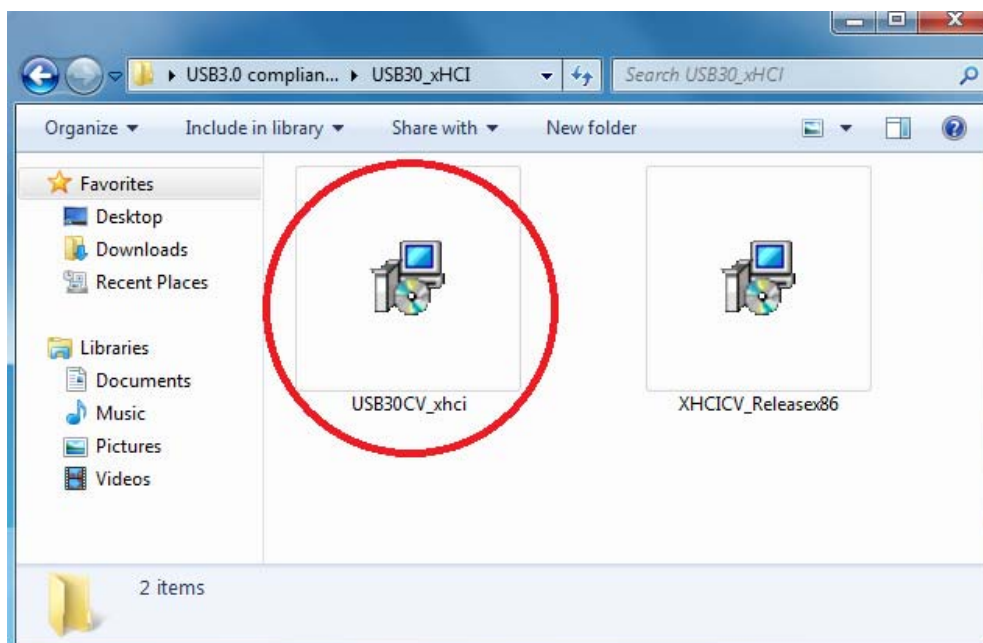
## 3.0 Installation Procedure

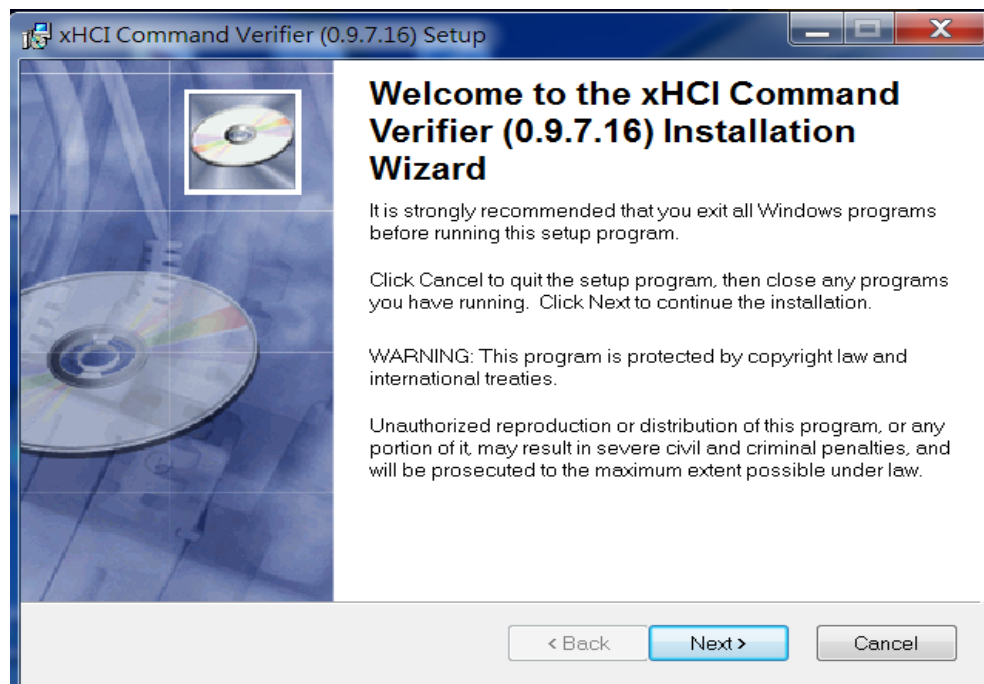
Step 1: First, install “USB30 CV\_ 0.9.8.2” (CV test latest version)





Step2: install "USB30 CV\_xhci"(version 0.9.7.16)





## 4.0 Measurement Procedure

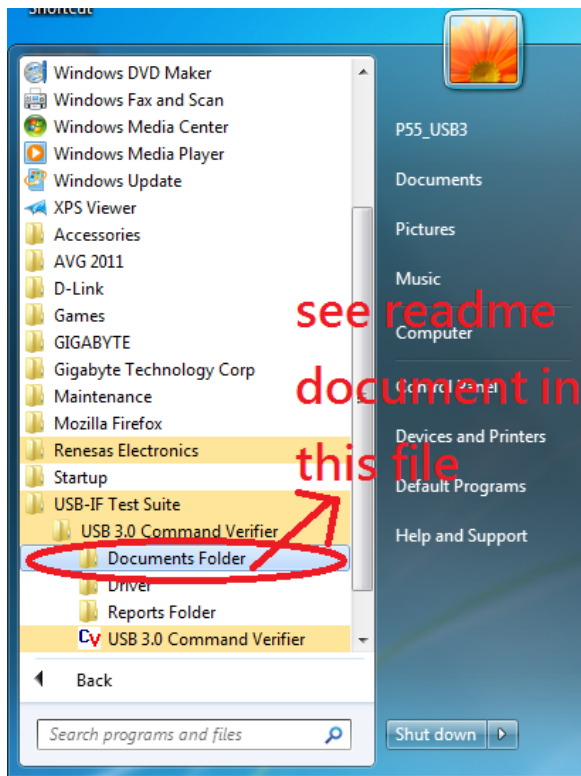
Reminder:

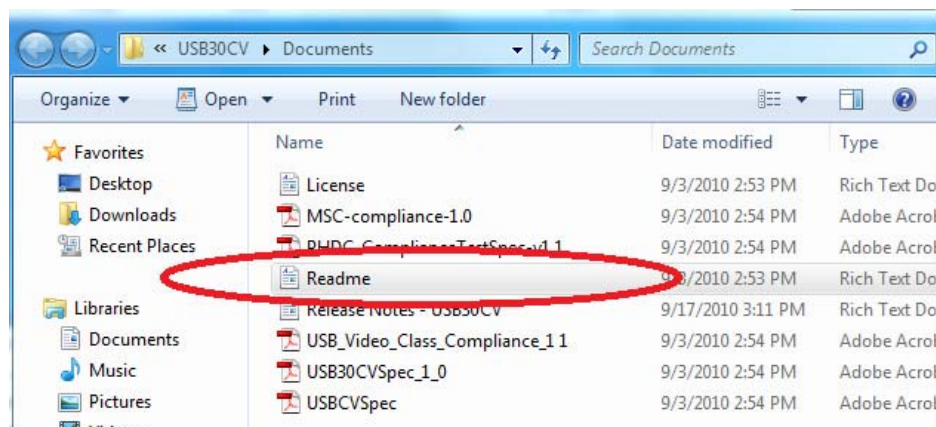
1. In CV and xHCI test, the host controller driver should be changed to "xHCI Compliance Test Host Controller". Please see details below.
2. In CV and xHCI test, there only can be "one" USB3.0 host controller on MB. If there is already another USB3.0 controller on MB, it should be disabled, and then you can perform the CV and xHCI test to the one on USB3.0 host card.

Step 1:

After installing the CV and xHCI test program, see the readme file in the "Documents File" folder.

Download "usb.if" file from: [http://www.usb.org/developers/tools/comp\\_dump](http://www.usb.org/developers/tools/comp_dump), and then put the file in "USBCV/lib" folder.

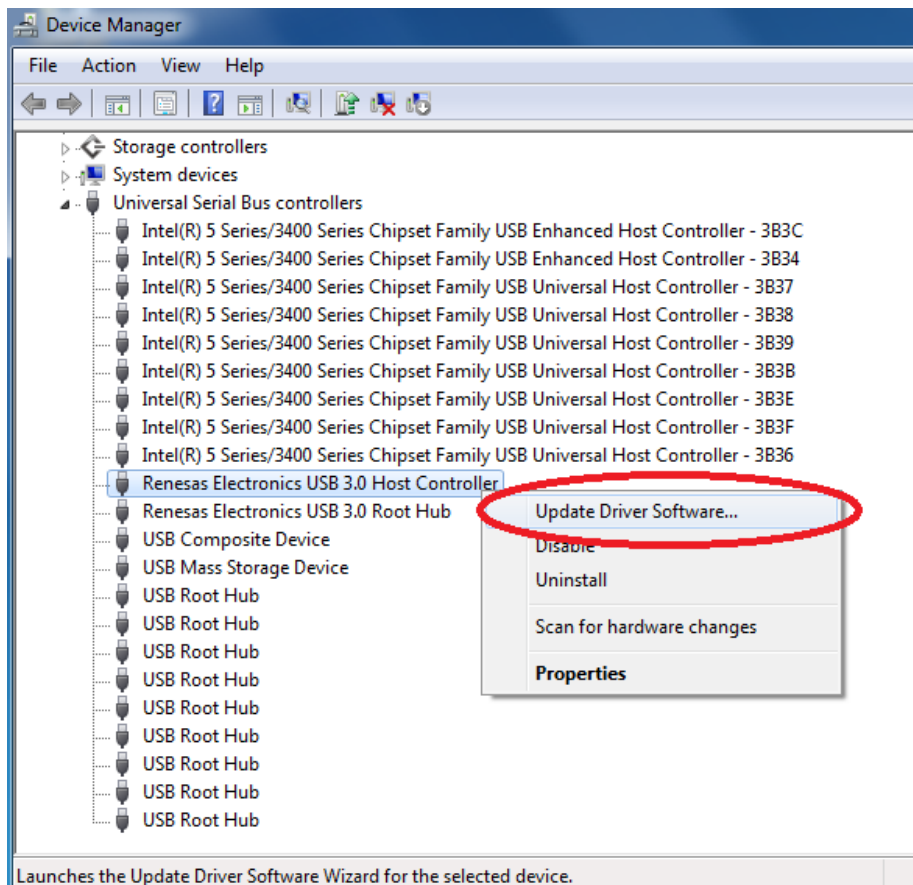
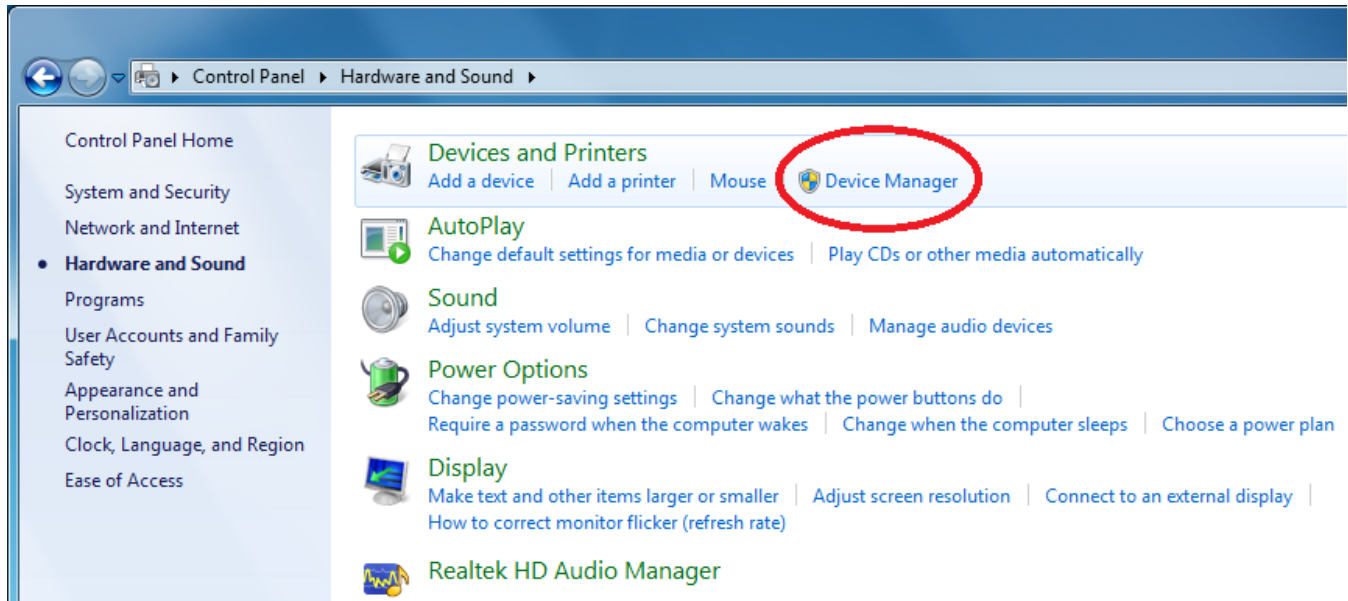

In order for you to operate the USB30CV properly, you must follow these steps:

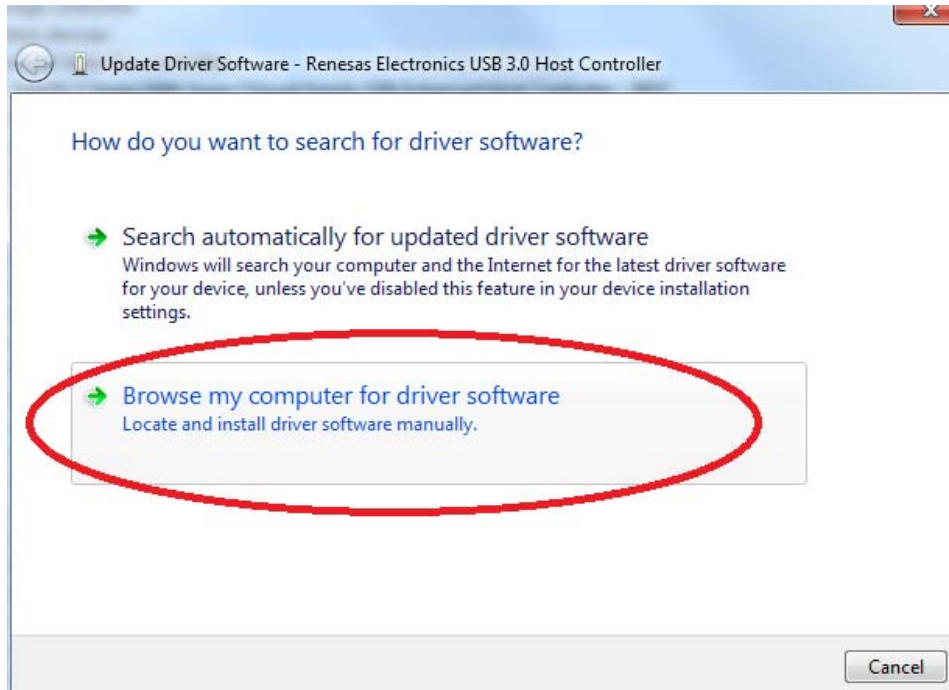
- 1.) In order to use USB30CV, User Account Control (UAC) must be turned off. After turning off UAC, the system must be rebooted in order for the changes to take effect.
- 2.) On the 64-bit edition of Windows 7, you must disable Driver Signature Enforcement in order to use USB30CV. At system start-up, press F-8 for Advanced Boot Options screen, then select *Disable Driver Signature Enforcement*.
- 3.) Download the file **usb.if** from the USB-IF Tools website:  
[http://www.usb.org/developers/tools/comp\\_dump](http://www.usb.org/developers/tools/comp_dump)  
 Place this file inside of the USB30CV/lib folder
- 4.) Before running USB30CV, install the xHCI Compliance driver (xHCIdrv.sys). This driver is located in the Program Files\USB-IF Test Suite\USB30CV\Driver\Host folder. For more information on how to install the driver, please refer to the PDK Technical guide located at the USB-IF SuperSpeed Tools website:
